It is a good place to become better acquainted with other photographers from the N4C region in a beautiful natural setting.

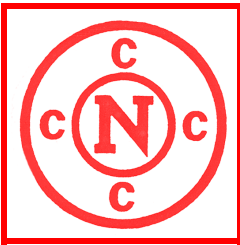
### **N4C PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE**

## Keep It Simple

Simple scenes facilitate compositions and clarify the purpose of the photo. Concentrate on showing one subject or one idea at a time.

Before you squeeze the shutter release, inspect the scene in the viewfinder. Examine every part of the picture for distracting intrusions, because your camera lens will catch all that is in the viewfinder.

Eliminate these distractions, use a new viewpoint, or find a plain background, such as blue sky or a lawn.

You might try blurring the background by using a wide lens opening, such as f/2.8. You can often make a background out of focus by moving in close to your subject.
