N4C Loses A Dear Friend! Margarieta Delle, 1923 – 2003

Margarieta Delle was born January 23, 1923, an only child to Peter and Alisa Delle, in Riga, Latvia.

During World War II, when she was only 18 years old, the Germans took her and others to Germany to work in the factories. When Germany's defeat was near, all workers were released and they had much difficulty finding food and shelter.

Within a year, the United States established refugee camps, and she spent several years in these camps. When churches in America began sponsoring refugees, Margarieta was brought to lowa City, Iowa, by the Zion Lutheran Church. She became an outstanding American citizen. She earned both her Bachelor and Masters Degrees in Biochemistry. She worked forty years in the Cardiac Research Lab at the University of Iowa Hospitals & Clinics. She retired in 1993 at age 70.

Margarieta was an artist — dealing with life as an artist.

She was a charter member of the Iowa City Camera Club. She received the North Central Camera Club Council's Service Award in 1977 and was a recipient of the Founders Award in 1991.

She has been a mentor to many aspiring photographers. In recent years she combined her love for music and photography to produce outstanding slide essays to entertain and educate. She was a member of the lowa City Bird Club and was involved until her death. She was a dedicated birder, a naturalist, known throughout the area for her identification of bird songs. She had a great ear for bird songs and had taught courses on birding.

For the past 40 years, she has been involved statewide in the Iowa Ornitholis Birding Association. She had done field studies on Tanager and Wood Thrush species for the Cornell Ornithology Laboratory.

She had volunteered for frog surveys and reported and kept records for the Depart-

ment of Natural Resources in the Hawkeye Wildlife Area.

She was also instrumental in the preservation of Rochester Cemetery in Cedar County.

Margarieta Delle died Thursday, May 15, 2003 at Mercy Hospital, in Iowa City, of pneumonia. Memorial services were held Wednesday, May 21, 2003.

COMMENTS/TIPS ABOUT STEREO SLIDES

The judges at the NSA UMR Camera Club really enjoyed seeing the slides that were submitted for the April N4C Stereo Competition. There is a lot of stereo photography talent in the North Central Region, and we hope to see more examples in the future.

The judges saw two areas where people could improve their chances for higher scores in the competition. The first was, (if at all possible) preview your entries before the competition by projecting them. Our judging was done, as per N4C rules, by projecting the images with a stereo projector and viewing them with polarized glasses (our club uses a TDC 116 Stereo Projector with 5" lenses and tungsten bulbs, projected at 15' onto a Da-Lite Versatol silver lenticular screen).

After our judging was completed, one of the judges wanted to look at one of the slides again. She viewed it in a Stereo Realist viewer with a halogen bulb, and found that the slide looked very different in the viewer than on the screen. At that point all of the judges reviewed all of the slides in the viewer and said that they would have given higher points to several of the images if they had appeared the same way on screen as they now appeared in the viewer.

Several images had details that were not apparent when projected, and some had color shifts, which looked more natural in the viewer. Sometimes a great view when seen in a viewer will look quite different when projected. For competitions it is best to select views that look good when viewed as the judges will see them.

The second recommendation was for entrants to use commercially manufactured slide mounts for cropping slides (they come in many sizes) if the photographer does not fully understand interocular spacing. A few of the entries used tape, cardboad, or aluminum masks to reduce the image size of their slides for cropping. In most cases, it caused the standard horizonal alignment to move, and required the projector settings to be readjusted for proper viewing.

Our club did take the time to adjust the projector for each view, however, excessive adjustments from standard did result in lower technical scores for those images. Many clubs do not readjust any of the projector settins (other than focus) for competitions once they hae been set. Any slide that's chips are not centered at 2.4" will show excessive misalignment and receive reduced points.

We hope that these tips will help to increase the stereo competitor's scores in future competitions. Thank you for letting our club judge the April competition.
