Rules for Camera Club Bulletin Competition

- 1. This annual competition will only be conducted in April.
- 2. N4C clubs may enter any one bulletin from the current competition season. This entry should be representative of the club's best newsletter work.
- The First Vice-President, assisted by Director #1, will announce the judging arrangement for this competition in the January and February issues of the N4C News Bulletin.
- 4. The judging system is based on a total of 45 points. Neatness, method of reproduction, and quality of the content of the newsletter will be given consideration.
- Awards will be presented to the First, Second, Third, and Honorable Mention positions. The winning bulletins will be announced at the N4C Annual Convention.
- 6. Clubs will accrue points toward the Club of the Year Award as follows:

First – 8 points Second – 6 points Third – 4 points Honorable Mention – 2 points

Send three (3) copies of the same bulletin issue to Dwight Tomes by April 30, 2007.

N4C President's Message

Back before 1980 if a photograph was entered into court in connection with a trial, the photograph showed exactly what took place when the photograph was taken. Since then, with the advent of digital imaging, photographs can be changed. This change has caused camera clubs to develop **Ethics Statements and Standards of Conduct** for people entering photography competition contests. These Ethics Standards might have statements as follows:

Images submitted for competition shall originate as photographs by the entrant on photographic emulsion or acquired digitally. When the photographer enters the competition, the photographer certifies the work as his or her own. Any image accepted (the image received an award) in a contest shall not be re-entered in the same format in the same contest by using a different title or a like in-camera duplication or a reproduction duplication. Any accepted (or an award-winning image) may not be re-titled for entry in the same contest again.

Because images can be manipulated or changed, some photography categories have specific statements relative to what is allowed and what is not allowed. Specifically, these ethics statements are needed for "Nature," "Photo Travel," and "Photojournalism" contests. The statement for the Nature category could be as follows:

No computer manipulations or enhancements are allowed in Nature Contests. No elements may be moved, cloned, added, deleted, rearranged or combined. No manipulation or modification is permitted except resizing, cropping, selective lightening or darkening, and restoration of original color of the scene. No special effect filters can be applied, and any sharpening must appear natural.

The statements for the Photo Travel contests read the same as the Nature statements. Photo Travel also has some additional statements as follows:

Photo Travel requires the presentation of the subject matter in its natural state. Photo Travel images are not to be "staged" or set up, close-ups and studio photographs are excluded, and the background should include enough detail to indicate where it was taken. The intention of Photo Travel images is to show aspects of the world as they exist.

For Photojournalism: the interest of credibility, photographs which misrepresent the truth, such as manipulation to alter the subject matter, or situations which are set up for the purpose of photography, are not acceptable in Photojournalism competitions.

MOUNTAINS AND PICTORIALISM

Many of us will be going to the mountains this summer and a word of advice about photographing mountains appeared last month (April 1956) in the Royal Photographic Society Journal, in an article entitled "MOUNTAINS AND PICTORIALISM" by H.A. Murch, FRPS.

No print has ever glowed as sunshine glows nor dazzled like the gleaming snow. No print has ever given anyone snowblindness. None have the quality of evening. The rendering of these things will depend upon the individuality of the photographer and not on the camera through interpretation. Results usually fall short of expectations.

Height is often needed to characterize a mountain yet the result often will result in a row of lilliputian mole hills. Here are some of the ways to suggest height;

- 1. The most obvious way is to place the peak at the top of the print.
- 2. A less obvious way is to place a strong accent near the base or to have strong lines leading in that direction, but there must be adequate material above.
- 3. Let the distant tones be light. The lighter the tone of the distant plane the further away it seems, therefore the larger we feel it to be. This light tone may be contrasted effectively with a heavy foreground. In misty weather small cliffs nearby can seem huge.

- 4. Let there be plenty of foreground so that the distant hills are high in the picture space. To justify itself, such a deep foreground should not be without interest, but, if the primary interest be in the mountains, care should be taken that the foreground is supporting and not competitive.
- 5. Include a long unbroken line, straight or gently curved, leading steeply upwards from the bottom left. This carries the eye up with great impetus.
- 6. Cut off the top to remove all the skyline. This allows the imagination to rear upwards.
- 7 Let the print be upright and of a narrow format.

You may have been waiting for the two:

- a. Get close to the mountain.
- b. Include figures to give scale.

But as a general rule these are not recommended because:

If a viewpoint be near and low it will give undue emphasis to the near cliffs which might hide the peak altogether. If it be near and high, the more distant peaks may appear above or on a level with our main peak, in either case its domination is gone.

If a figure is to indicate proper height and scale, it must be the same distance from the camera as the mountain with which it is to be compared. At such distance a puny man would be invisible and we would not see our basis of comparison.

If you want the mountain to dominate, you will not let it nestle under the bough of a nearby tree.

Last two bits of advice from this article:

- 1. See BIG, be simple.
- Don't step back without looking there may be nothing to step on!




