Summary of N4C Board Meeting

The semi-annual Executive Board Meeting of the North Central Camera Club Council was called to order Friday, April 25, 2008, by President Bob Rude at Springbrook State Park, Iowa.

The Secretary's Report was read by Pat Schwope and approved.

The Treasurer's Report was given by Lynda Richards and approved. There are 40 clubs in N4C. Profit from the 2007 Marshalltown Convention was \$1,704.14.

Springbrook: Chairmen Larry and Delores Meister reported 63 registrations for 2008.

The Judging Rules Committee: George Bebout reported on new rules proposed for Nature photography. Nature Digital Adjustment Guidelines are to be added. A Panorama Print Contest as a special event at Springbrook 2009 and judged by the RV Digital Club was proposed.

Ken Johnson reported on participation in the Digital Nature and Pictorial contests.

There was a discussion about eliminating comments on N4C entries, and using the Technique, Compostion, and Interest scores in judging. As is done in PSA, Slide Study groups and Print Analysis are currently available through N4C for a learning experience.

Ken Johnson reported that the N4C website <www.N4C.US> has been redesigned since last summer. He also said Slide Circuit #6 is the only remaining active slide circuit.

Contest Committee: Diane Darnielle made a number of recommendations regarding N4C contests. A motion was made to deactivate Stereo Slide Contests. 2 1/4 Slide Contests will be held with double entries allowed. Digital Contemporary/Creative Contests will be added in September 2008. Exploration of Digital Photojournalism Contests with John Larson as chairman was carried. A place for beginning photographers to compete was discussed.

Curt Stoever, 1st Vice President, would like to find a way to get new people involved in Springbrook.

Photo Essay Rules are to be revised and modified.

New Club Coordinator Gloria Johnston reported that North Iowa Photo Club in Mason City, Iowa, has joined N4C. Bill Cornelius, President of Muddy River Camera Club in Clinton, Iowa, was at the Springbrook weekend.

Nancy Carter, Bulletin Editor, will be resigning after the August issue of the Bulletin.

Handbook/Directory Editor Mary Jane Charlton would like to split the 2008-2009 Handbook into two books and sell each hard copy separately.

Minnesota Valley will host the 2008 N4C Convention September 25-28 at the Airport Hilton in Bloomington, Minnesota.

In 2009 Duluth-Superior will host from September 28 to October 4.

In 2010 LaCrosse will host from September 15-19 at the Radisson.

Jayne Owen, Supply Chair, is working on a solution to the problem of staples in ribbons.
