

President's Corner – September 2012

I want to start by thanking the Des Moines Area Camera Club for hosting the 2012 N4C Convention and those members who gave up hours and hours of their time to put on a great convention. For those of you who missed it, the winning images taken at the Sculpture Garden, State Capital and the Botanical Gardens, along with new ideas shared by the various photographers and speakers will be challenged by the rural images ripe for picking in Creston, Iowa (SW Iowa Shutterbugs – October 4-5) next year.

Thirteen years ago I finished my Saturday chores and decided to grab my camera and check out the "First Annual Polar Bear Plunge – for Wisconsin Special Olympics", being held a few miles from my house. Kerry and the Special Olympics Staff had planned a plunge through the ice to raise money for the local Special Olympics Athletes. Their hopes were to have 75 to 100 plunges and raise maybe \$10,000.00, but when the day came, 300 hearty soles showed up to jump through a hole in the ice for those special athletes and added tens of thousands to the kitty. When I got to the Post-Plunge Party, with a few digital photo CD's of the plungers (door prizes and for the organization) I ate with Kerry's boss, from Park & Recand part of one of the plunging groups. This started my volunteering as an event photographer and opened the door the La Crosse Area Camera Club.

The next year several members of the La Crosse Area Camera Club were on the scene capturing their award winning images and sharing their best with the Special Olympics Organization. We have also teamed up with the Park & Rec Department for their "Winter RecFest" and other non-profit sponsored events. These donated images have helped those organizations write grant after grant, plus promote the event next year and even generated several year-end images.

This volunteering effort has opened dozens of doors for our members to get behind the scenes and get images that are not accessible by the general public. We do not volunteer to photograph an event covered by a professional photographer, thus displacing his or her income. I know several other N4C Members, from other clubs, who also volunteer their time and I thank them too.

Over a half century ago, Dr. Robert M. Cochran, Francis A. Kingsbury, E. Curtis Lugg and Stan T. Anderson donated their time and efforts to create this organization and ever since members have volunteered to be an officer, host a convention, speak at an event or just share their photographic skills.

MINUTES OF THE N4C ANNUAL BUSINESS MEETING, SEPTEMBER 7, 2012

The Annual Business Meeting of the North Central Camera Club Council was called to order at 3:35 p.m., Friday, September 7, 2012, by President Ken Johnson, at the Airport Holiday Inn, Des Moines, Iowa. Nine Executive Board Members were present. Absent were Director No. 3, Darlene Kutzler, and Director No. 5, Tom Castle.

A film clip was shown by Ken Johnson to demonstrate the potential of video. Two guest PSA Region Directors were introduced: Carole Kropscott, Region 6 (Western Missouri and Kansas) and Jim Atkins, Region 19 (Nebraska, Iowa, and South Dakota.)

A corrected sentence in the April 27, 2012, Executive Board minutes was read by Pat Schwope, Secretary. A motion to accept the minutes as corrected was made by Gerald Bonsack, seconded by Lynda Richards, and carried.

The Financial Report from August 1, 2011 through July 31, 2012, audited by Sharon Allen on September 2, 2012, was read by Lynda Richards, Treasurer. Balance On Hand August 1, 2011: \$6,510.71. Receipts: \$9,651.10. Expenses: \$9,541.75. Checking Balance On Hand July 31, 2012: \$6,620.06. Certificate of Deposit: \$7,569.41, plus interest of \$102.38 = \$7,671.79. Net Worth As Of July 31, 2012: \$14,291.85. We have 39 clubs, having lost Ames, Chippewa Valley, and TCI, and having gained Black Hills and Central Kansas. 14 clubs still owe 2012-2013 dues. A motion to approve the Financial Report was made by Lynda Richards, seconded by Jo Eland, and carried.

Gerald Bonsack, First Vice President, thanked the Des Moines Camera Club for hosting the Convention. Convention Chairman Diane Darnielle said 30 camera club members were involved with the Convention. Director No. 1 Scott Udey mentioned that the Topeka Camera Club has purchased a new projector with the funds earned at the 2011 Convention, and that they really appreciate everyone coming to Topeka last year.

Gloria Johnston, New Club Coordinator, said she is sorry to lose Ames, but they did not want to be involved in judging. Ken pointed out that Ames did honor their obligations this year, even though they did not care to judge. Gloria is working with Steve Thompson on recruiting the Aberdeen, South Dakota, club. Carole Kropscott will contact the Central Kansas club.

Sharla Glick, Bulletin Editor, said she appreciates the contest results coming from Ken and Diane, with the spreadsheet data and the club member numbers. She would really like more information from the clubs, sharing ideas about how they do things. That exchange of ideas helps other clubs.

Gene Schwope, Bulletin Publisher, said there have been no issues in sending the Bulletin out. It's been a good year in terms of people not changing their e-mail addresses.

Ken Johnson, Digital Advisory and Website Committees, reported that 27 clubs have participated in digital contests: 54% of all entries. Print entries were 32.6%, and Slide entries were 12.7%. 90 entries from 23 clubs participated in a digital black and white contest. A password-protected web page has been set up so clubs can download the latest judging software. Member numbers are now required for all contests. The N4C website continues to grow. The Yuku Forum is under-utilized. Ken did not enter the PSA Website Contest this year, because the software he uses does not allow him to correct some of the suggestions for improvement. The comments he appreciates are those made by our own N4C members.

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The N4C Handbook and Directory should be out soon. The list of September Judging Clubs has been sent out to all clubs.

Gene Schwope, PSA Contact, reported that PSA's CPID (Color Projected Image Division) and EID (Electronic Imaging Division) have ended. Projected Images (PID) has become a new division; Carole Kropscott is the News Editor for the new division. In the 2012 Council Challenge, N4C ended up in 6th Place overall. Ken Johnson won an award in Prints, and Diane Darnielle won an award in Projected Images. PSA's Conference has not yet been held, so these awards will be handed out at Springbrook.

In the PSA Youth Showcase, St. Paul Camera Club member Madelyn Stocking won Photojournalism Print of the Year. Ed Lower mentioned that Thomas Garrett, a student from Davenport, Iowa, sponsored by Color Shooters, won First Honorable Mention in Photojournalism Digital. Scott Udey can enter the PSA Youth Showcase for his own students and for students from other high schools in town, but he has to have a sponsoring club.

Carole Kropscott, a member of the Kansas City Digital Dimensions and Beyond Club, spoke about PSA, and introduced Jim Atkins, who is a member of the Lincoln Camera Club. PSA Regional Directors will be changing to State Directors.

Wilford Yoder, Founders Award and Service Award Committees, encouraged nominations, but said it can be hard to get background information on people, which is necessary.

Dwight Tomes, Photo-Essays, said there were 14 entries this year, judged by Southwest Iowa Shutterbugs following Springbrook.

Future N4C Conventions: October 4-5, 2013, in Creston, Iowa, with Southwest Iowa Shutterbugs hosting, and September 11-14, 2014, in Hudson, Wisconsin, with Kaposia, North Metro, and Women's Color Photo host-ing.

The 2014 Convention was approved by the Board in an e-mail vote on August 20, 2012. Linda Rutherford of Women's Color said that \$500 will be needed for a down payment on the Hudson House. Linda said, "They do things a little bit differently, in that they do not have a meeting room charge. You have to have the catered meal with it, and that meal is priced to include the meeting room; so the meals will look expensive, but just be aware that's including your meeting room space. There won't be a separate conference charge -- it's all rolled into one. You might as well order the meal, because that's the only way you're going to get to the conference. You pay for it, you better eat it. That's just the way they do it, and that's what we're going to have to deal with." Ed Siems, Convention Planning Chairman, reminded us that the host club keeps 75%; 25% comes back to N4C.

Old Business: Business items from the past; changes that will occur for this coming year. Number codes in addition to abbreviation codes in judging software. We would like to have an N4C Club Contact person designated in each of the clubs -- Club Contact Guidelines have been added to the N4C Handbook. The Club Bulletin contest will be enlarged, and will be called the Club Communication Contest -- a club bulletin or a club website can be entered. We did make some changes in our terminology -- "Digital", "2 x 2 Film Slides", "Creative", "Journalism", "Travel". New contest rules are on the website on the competitions page. Diane Darnielle reported that outside judges will be used for the Digital Black and White contests.

New Business: Ken is hoping that we might get some help on public relations: a program about N4C, a brochure about N4C, a welcome program for new clubs to encourage and help them to participate and attend. A program on Springbrook, which Carole Kropscott put together, is on the website meetings page. Open forum for discussion: display racks need to be easier to put together. Print racks will be on the agenda for Springbrook; Gene Schwope will bring literature to Springbrook about the display racks used by TCACCC. There was a round of applause for Ed Siems, who put together the current print racks, as well as the light-boxes

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Francis Kingsbury said, "I have some concern about the clubs that are dropping out because they don't like competition. It behooves N4C to find activities that will keep those clubs." Ken Johnson said, "There are a lot of opportunities for helping in various areas within N4C. I'd certainly entertain anyone who would like to work in some particular area; please talk to me or to Gerry Bonsack. We'd like to have you involved."

Ken announced that the 2012-2013 Board members will be installed at the end of the Banquet on Saturday night:

I wondered whether our comparisons limit our results. What really are the tools of our trade and is there such a thing as too few or too many?

Beyond a photographer, I want to be an artist who can aptly demonstrate my vision to those who see my work. So, while I am awfully fond of my camera (and lenses, of course!) I am equally enthralled with Photoshop (and Silver Efex, OnOne, Portrait Photography, HDR Efex, Topaz, Light- Room, Tiffen DfX-I am a techno junkie) and the computer to run it all! I want the tools to create what my mind can see- that means being the best behind my camera AND in front of my computer! It doesn't matter to me whether the filter goes on the camera lens or is applied in the computer, and I am going to admit it.

I don't often talk about my fondness for the post-production work, because I didn't think I should like it- this is the camera club, after all! Isn't any work I do on the computer only the result of my failure to achieve the work in the camera and why should that be celebrated? Au contraire! I was limiting myself-my computer is simply an extension of my camera, much as a very good lens is and I am going to enjoy it. I'm good with that.

So this month, I'm coming out in defense of *whatever it takes* to create the vision! I am going to rejoice in my tools – and maybe see what else is out there for me to learn and use! What tools are you going to celebrate?
