# **PSA Rules for Nature Photography Are Being Revised**

As you may have heard: The three largest amateur photographic organizations in the world, FIAP, the International Federation of Photographic Art; RPS, the Royal Photographic Society; and PSA, the Photographic Society of America; have agreed to use one new standardized definition of Nature Photography, beginning in 2015.

Vacationing N4C President, Diane Darnielle, asked me to write this short article to assure our N4C Nature Photographers that N4C will be examining the new international rules, and will make whatever internal changes are necessary. Our goal is to be sure that photographers from N4C can continue to enter PSA Sanctioned International Nature Exhibitions.

Having read the new combined rules, it appears to me that any actual changes are minor, and that images made under current N4C Rules could still be entered next year in PSA Exhibitions. The main difference I see is that the new combined rules will continue to allow for images that are certified to be Authentic Wildlife.

This landmark agreement between FIAP, RPS, and PSA is certain to have a ripple effect in other photographic areas, and perhaps even the rules for Photojournalism, Photo Travel, Pictorial, and Contemporary photography.

Rest assured that N4C will be keeping abreast of any changes to photographic definitions, and will revise its rules, as needed.

The following definition for nature photography was agreed to between FIAP, RPS and PSA and will take effect from 2015.

#### **Nature Photography Definition**

Nature photography is restricted to the use of the photographic process to depict all branches of natural history, except anthropology and archaeology, in such a fashion that a well-informed person will be able to identify the subject material and certify its honest presentation. The story telling value of a photograph must be weighed more than the pictorial quality while maintaining high technical quality. Human elements shall not be present, except where those human elements are integral parts of the nature story such as nature subjects, like barn owls or storks, adapted to an environment modified by humans, or where those human elements are in situations depicting natural forces, like hurricanes or tidal waves. Scientific bands, scientific tags or radio collars on wild animals are permissible. Photographs of human created hybrid plants, cultivated plants, feral animals, domestic animals, or mounted specimens are ineligible, as is any form of manipulation that alters the truth of the photographic statement.

No techniques that add, relocate, replace, or remove pictorial elements except by cropping are permitted. Techniques that enhance the presentation of the photograph without changing the nature story or the pictorial content, or without altering the content of the original scene, are permitted including HDR, focus stacking and dodging/burning. Techniques that remove elements added by the camera, such as dust spots, digital noise, and film scratches, are allowed. Stitched images are not permitted. All allowed adjustments must appear natural. Color images can be converted to grey-scale monochrome. Infrared images, either direct-captures or derivations, are not allowed. Images used in Nature Photography competitions may be divided in two classes: Nature and Wildlife. Images entered in Nature sections meeting the Nature Photography Definition above can have landscapes, geologic formations, weather phenomena, and extant organisms as the primary subject matter. This includes images taken with the subjects in controlled conditions, such as zoos, game farms, botanical gardens, aquariums and any enclosure where the subjects are totally dependent on man for food.

Images entered in Wildlife sections meeting the Nature Photography Definition above are further defined as one or more extant zoological or botanical organisms free and unrestrained in a natural or adopted habitat. Landscapes, geologic formations, photographs of zoo or game farm animals, or of any extant zoological or botanical species taken under controlled conditions are not eligible in Wildlife sections. Wildlife is not limited to animals, birds and insects. Marine subjects and botanical subjects (including fungi and algae) taken in the wild are suitable wildlife subjects, as are carcasses of extant species. Wildlife images may be entered in Nature sections of Exhibitions.

# N4C Contest Changes for 2014-2015

**Digital B&W** (new every month), **Digital Creative**, **Digital Journalism**, **Digital Nature**, **Digital Pictorial**, and **Digital Travel** are all monthly contests.

**B&W Prints** and **Nature Prints** are separate contests, and can be sent together to the designated judging club. Likewise both **Travel Prints** and **Journalism Prints** can be sent to their designated club for judging. These four print contests are monthly.

# Learning Photoshop and Lightroom

Enjoy learning new features and techniques so easy to find on the internet. I just added a link to a neat keyboard shortcut map for both Photoshop and Lightroom.

Earlier this year a new feature was added to this page. Click on the "Ken's Picks" link at the top to take you to that section. These are videos or articles that I feel are of particular interest to photographers. It is impossible to highlight all the great free instruction available. I just want to whet your appetite for learning with a few that I've watched and thought were especially help-ful, such as Hidden Gems in PS, 10 Basic's to do in PS, Difference between Bridge and Lightroom, Removing Color Casts, and a slick add-on to use Textures with PS.

Worth mentioning - it is still possible for a limited time to join the <u>Adobe Creative Cloud</u> plan. It includes access to Photoshop CC and Lightroom desktop, mobile and web, plus feature updates and upgrades as they are available, 20 GB of cloud storage for file sharing and collaboration, and a Behance ProSite. And it's just \$9.99/month when you sign up for a one-year plan. <u>https://</u> <u>creative.adobe.com/plans/offer/photoshop+lightroom</u>.

This will give you licenses for installations on two computers and <u>Lightroom Mobile</u> which will sync a designated LR Collection (even Raw files) with an iPad & iPhone
