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### President's Message

#### Happy Holidays to All of You!

It is once again that time of year when we all gather for celebrations some with families and sometimes we are with our "adopted families" if we cannot make the usual family gatherings. So clear your memory cards, charge your batteries, and clean your lenses and get ready for the fun! I celebrate a very quick holiday with my family and then two days later head to Trivandrum, India to teach a course on Hospice, Pain and Palliative Care for the three week winter break and will arrive back in Iowa less than 48 hours before the start of the spring semester in January. On this trip I will take 15 University of Iowa students (most of them nursing students) to learn about hospice as well as make home visits with the teams from Pallium India. It is always a life changing experience for me as well as the students and I return to Iowa confident that I have no problems. As I've told you previously, with permission of the families I take photographs of them, have 5 x 7's made (there is an amazing Kodak lab about 100 feet from our hotel that will make a 5 x 7 for twenty-five cents!) and the next time they are visited by the team from the hospice they give them the photos.

It's Sunday night and I've just finished a two day art show where I sell images and have a really good time. You may have done this in the past, or are even considering it in the future, so there is probably lots of advice that people can give you. At this moment I'm really very tired and plan on doing nothing of any value the rest of the evening and it will be a "coffee infused me" to face Monday morning. If you are considering participating in such an adventure here are some of my thoughts. First off, many shows are juried, meaning that you have to submit between 3-5 images to be judged and if they like your work you get in after paying a fee. For what it's worth, I got rejected twice when I first started to apply. There is usually a charge to be judged up to \$30 and booth fees vary widely ranging anywhere from not much to \$250 and more. Well established art shows have good attendance and are usually easier to make some money at but the smaller shows may not be worth your time and effort. Don't forget to include travel costs and overnight housing if the show is a distance from you.

Getting ready to do a show takes quite a bit of effort as I take 16 x 20, 11 x 14, 8 x 10 equaling about 300 matted prints, 50 note card packages and about 400 greeting cards. I use 5 four foot tables which are easier to put in my Prius complete with table clothes, a variety of containers for the prints, lights for an indoor show, my tent frame and it's mesh walls (I have regular tent walls for outdoor shows as well), and a couple of chairs. Once you are set up and ready to open, it becomes FUN!

So after all that preparation where is the FUN? - you get to see people like your images, ask you about them and transport you through the time when you shot it. To me this is absolutely the most fun of doing a show. For instance this weekend by telling people about images I was transported to China, Italy, India, the Grasslands of Saskatchewan, various Canadian adventures with photographer friends and the list goes on and on. As tired as I am right now I'm still basking in the glow of remembering all of those wonderful adventures with new friends and a camera in my hand.

Okay so you may be thinking "Do you make lots of money?" Right now I only do about three shows a year because of my full time "day job." Many of my fellow artists at the shows do one show a week from late April through mid-October or later. It is their full time job and there is certainly money to be made but in my opinion they really earn it. I make enough to more than cover expenses of the show, expenses of preparing images for the show, and have money left over. Does doing 3 shows a year pay for the trips I take - absolutely not!

This is turning out to be a bit longer than anticipated but I didn't want to close without talking a bit about drones after my article last month's article. When I first bought my drone I called the Iowa City Police Department and the Campus Security Office who told me there were no regulations on drones in Iowa City so I proceeded to go flying and have fun. It didn't even occur to me to look consider getting information from the FAA. I received an e-mail from one of our N4C members who has been a long time pilot and shared with me the Proposed new Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations for drones. The new proposed regulations have quite a list of requirements include registering our drones with the FAA and requiring special permissions for using drones for commercial purposes. I have requested more information from the member who wrote to me regarding when the proposed regulations will be permanent and how is the FAA ever going to attempt to register the one million drones that are predicted to be purchased at Christmas and will share what he says. You can certainly get more answers by going here <a href="https://www.faa.gov/uas/model\_aircraft">https://www.faa.gov/uas/model\_aircraft</a> So my best advice is to go on the FAA site and see what they're saying as most of the rules are common sense. When our N4C member responds with more information (and it's clear he's really on the ball) I'll let you know. Until then, be careful but have fun.

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# Southwest Iowa Shuttterbugs' Camera Club Judging Procedures

Southwest Iowa Shutterbugs(SWIS) makes judging a learning and social time for our members. We pick 3 qualified judges, our computer guru: Annette, our N4C chairperson(Digital or Print) to start with. All members are encouraged to attend. In expensive snacks are provided. We use the N4C judging software for prints and digital. It doesn't take that long to type in the information for the contest if it is prints. Same thing, image number, author number, category and title. It makes it so much more easier when it comes to the ties and rankings than doing it by hand. In digital we use two computers. One to enter numbers, the other is hooked to a tv on the wall, that is calibrated to the N4C color grid. The Chairperson flips the entries and Annette (Magic fingers)works the computer. For Prints we use our lightbox.

We start with the chairperson describing the contest category and description. Each judge has a dry marker board with T C I across the top. They show their numbers on the dry board to the recorder. They may at that time enter a number comment or as a group they may submit a comment. We prefer to have a good comment with the bad if there is one. The list of numbered comments or initial comments are in the judging software. They are not allowed to make any verbal comments until all judges have submitted their numbers. We do not feel there is hardly any photo that should receive a 2 unless it is in the wrong category or is a complete blur.
