President's Message

Greetings to all photographers, Spring is coming I have it on good authority!

It's March and it will only be a matter of weeks before those of us in the Southern region of N4C land will be in Spring. Last week I about choked as a friend who lives in Portland, sent me a photo of her blooming crocus (from this year)! Needless to say I was green with jealousy of it being that warm to have Spring's first blooms. That was followed by a friend who lives on Vancouver Island telling me all of his Spring flowers were in full bloom.

One gets educated in a number of ways in photography and this week I had a really tough realization not related to my photographs but those of a friend. One of my Canadian photographer friends got written permission from a foster Mother to photograph her two little First Nations girls (what we in the US call Native Americans). He regularly sells images through Getty and one of the photos was purchased for an advertising campaign that is against first nations children being taken out of Canada. The foster Mother and her husband lived in Canada for several years but were currently raising the two girls in Germany until their stepfather died but have since have returned to Canada. (The foster parents had permission to take the two children to Germany.) The foster Mother (also a friend) is devastated that the image was being used for such an advertising campaign as she and her late husband worked so very hard to give these children, now adolescents, a very good life. To ad to the difficulty Mother she officially could not have given "official" permission to allow the children to be photographed which she did not realize. The foster Mother of the girls has told the appropriate First Nations officials who will ask my photographer friend to remove the images from Getty. If there are any actions taken against Getty for selling the unauthorized images my photographer friend will have to assume the costs associated with any legal action. In this situation unfortunately everyone loses but should give us all cause to pause for what is normally an innocent hobby.

Moving on from gloom and doom, Springbrook will be here before we know it. It's a great way to greet Spring, learn some things, meet old friends, make new and it's cheap! Where else can you attend 2 days of meetings and have your meals furnished for that kind of money?(\$93/\$108)

You might also have seen in the last newsletter that the combined camera clubs in the Twin Cities region are having their annual Spring Break coming up the second weekend in March. That is also a high value for your dollar meeting and will feature Jeff Morgan, an old friend of N4C who used to live in the Twin Cities and Ian Plant as well. The Saturday and Sunday combined fee is \$65. again that is a HUGE bargain and I would encourage any N4C folks to take the drive up to a good meeting, eat some great food and do some shopping in the Twin Cities.

If you enjoy flowers you might want to check out one of my favorite places Longwood Gardens which is 30 miles south of Philadelphia and whose website is http://LongwoodGardens.org. I decided to "reward" myself for what has been a rather intense semester so far and head out in early April to exercise my shutter finger there as it has atrophied over the winter months. One of the many great things about Longwood is they have four indoor acres that are always groomed to perfection. Their 325 outdoor acres may well be waking up while I'm there depending upon the weather. For the record the floor of Pierce's woods has 250,000 crocus that will bloom this Spring and one of the many garden walks has 250,000 tulips planted. You never really know quite what to expect with Longwood but their designers always "blow my socks off."

Photoessays 2016!

It's easier than ever to do a photoessay in 2016 since a universal (Mac and PC) file type (.mp4) will be used so that your entry can be sent to me electronically, or alternatively on a memory stick or recorded on a DVD disk. This file type has approximately twice the image resolution of the photo essays submitted in 2014.

Your photoessay can be created in your software of choice, but should be exported in the .mp4 format. The .mp4 file entry may be recorded on a CD or DVD disk, a USB memory stick, or electronically via Dropbox. You can save your essay to my Dropbox account by using this link:

You can save to the folder "submit N4C photoessays 2016". I'll be able to view your essay from this folder. Please use the standard N4C naming convention—noted below—to help me keep track of your essay. Essays received on memory sticks or DVD's will also be placed in this folder location.

The Photo Essay chair should be consulted if there are questions about compatibility at d.tomes@me.com. Entries will be assembled for showing at Springbrook, at the Fall Convention, and for judging. The entry may be a collaborative effort of several people or of an entire club, with the club listed as the author. The member number of the club president of the club will be used for record keeping purposes The images must be the work of the entrant(s). The photoessay should contain music credits (but not the name of the maker or club).

This annual competition will only be conducted in April. Clubs can have as many entries as desired, but only one entry per member is allowed. Entry forms may be obtained from the N4C website, at the following web site http://www.n4c.us, or the Photo Essay chair. The essential information about your photo essay is best communicated by using the N4C file naming convention described at the bottom of this document. **The deadline for photo essay entries is March 31**.

The judging committee will consist of three judges (consistent with other N4C contests). The judging club members who have submitted entries to the photoessay contest may not be judges of the contest in the year their club is responsible for judging the contest. Judges who are not members of any affiliated club in N4C may be used provided that they have sufficient experience in judging photography contests similar to those in N4C and are willing to complete the necessary forms and provide feedback to contest entrants.

All the following will be considered by the judges:

Quality of the photography
Soundtrack Quality (music and narrative if included)
Impact, interest, and integration of sound and images.

The minimum number of images is twenty (20) with no limit on maximum number of images, but the program time shall not exceed six (6) minutes. Only still images (not Video Clips) can be used to compose the Photo Essay. The "Ken Burns" effect is permitted on individual images.

The title of the essay should be in standard N4C format, i.e. 01,N4C member number,PE,a great photoessay. [Example: 01,DE061,PE,a great photo essay] The entry (sent via dropbox or via regular mail on media such as a DVD disk or USB stick should have the following accompanying information: N4C member number, title, name of entrant, running time, e-mail address of the entrant, and telephone number of the entrant.
