I shot with that through college; mostly Tri-X and Kodachrome. After college, when I had a real job, I got my first DSL. It had a primitive light meter, but you had to set the aperture and shutter speed manually. Seems shocking now, you had to focus the camera too! My first digital was an EOS 300D in 2003. I soon left m darkroom behind, and I haven't looked back.
