(USE YOUR CLUB NAME AND MEMBER NUMBER INSTEAD OF DA044 - zero "0" 44 not a letter "O")

(USE DA, DB, DJ, DN, DP, or DT for the Contest Code - This example is for the Digital Nature Contest)

(Notice commas separating the data in the file names) 01,DA044,DN,Deer.jpg 03,DA022,DN,Grand Arch.jpg

04,DA033,DN,Teton Reflection.jpg 05,DA037,DN,White Water.jpg 06,DA002,DN,Shadows.jpg 07,DA025,DN,Horsetail Falls.jpg 08,DA018,DN,Soaring Eagle.jpg

Members should submit entries with filenames like the above except for the sequence numbers. The club N4C Rep will rename the files to include the sequence numbers. The club N4C Rep may want to keep things simple for the club members and handle ALL the file naming - how this is done is left to the club. The sequence numbers will determine the sequencing of the image in the judging line-up. All the contest entries will be sorted in alpha-numeric sequence by filename so this will mix up club entries for judging. The 01's from all the clubs will be judged first and the 08's at the end.

WHY DON'T I GET SHARP PHOTOS?

You take your photo and find your picture is not as Tack Sharp as you wanted. Maybe the camera just kept going back and forth with Autofocus and did not even let you take your picture. If your photos are not as sharp as you would like them to be, it is usually either because of Motion or Focus. We will start with Motion because that is more likely to be the cause when using newer cameras.

MOTION CAUSES

Tripod not used. If a Tripod is not used, the old rule of thumb is that you need to have the shutter speed at 1/x where x is the mm of the lens. So, if the lens is 100 mm, the minimum shutter speed should be 1/100. If the lens is 400 mm, the minimum shutter speed should be 1/400 and the minimum hand-held shutter speed should be 1/60. The vibration reduction control should be on. Check your shutter speed (which will change automatically when using Aperture Priority).

The problem encountered is likely operator error. The hand-holdable shutter speed is really different from person to person. It depends on the operator's hand steadiness, as well as the type of camera and its stabilization features. Using a crop sensor camera will increase the effect of motion.

Tripod used. If you are using a Tripod, have the vibration reduction control off. The reason is that the camera will make adjustments that affect movement. It will not know the camera is stable on a Tripod and will use its routine procedure to counteract what it thinks is a hand-held camera.

Moving Objects

Is it windy out there? Are leaves on the bushes waving? Then they will have motion blur. If the movement is slight, you might be able to fix it by increasing the shutter speed.

Another Kind of Moving Object, You! Many new photographers will push the shutter release button and push down the whole camera slightly. Gently squeeze the button, don't hammer it to take the shot quickly.

FOCUS CAUSES

Understand your camera. Go through your menu in focusing for specific camera information.

Depth of Field. Are you too close? Is it that only one small distance is in focus? Behind and before that point is out of focus. Then it might be Depth of Field. Things that will affect Depth of Field are (in the order of the most effect to the least) the Distance to the focus point, the lens mm, and the Aperture setting. You can step back, lower the lens mm, change the f-stop number.

Lack of contrast

Usually in the sky or at night. If your focus point is on a plain sky without much contrast, the lens will just zoom in and out without focusing. That's the signal that you need to move your focus point to a place with contrast. The same goes for shooting at night. On a dark night you may need to put your camera on autofocus, put lights on and push the release button halfway, then put the camera back on Manual and not Autofocus. That way you can get the camera focused on the light and then switch to Manual Focus in the dark after turning the light off again.

Lesser Focus Causes

Problem with lens. Sometimes the lens needs to be recalibrated. This requires you to take it in somewhere to see if it is working correctly.

Autofocus vs. Manual. In some cameras/lenses, both the lens and cameras have a choice for Autofocus or Manual Focus. Both the lens and camera need to be on Autofocus for it to work.

Lens is Dirty

This one sound obvious, but if your lens isn't clean, or if there is condensation or precipitation on the lens, it will show up on the photo.
